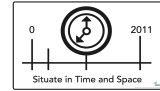

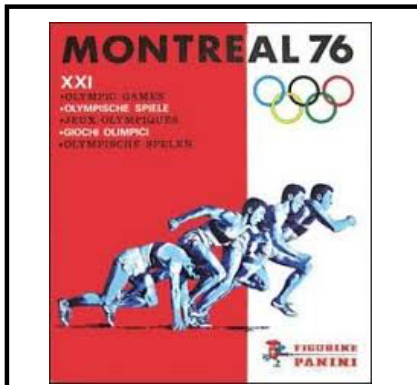

An Overview of the Province of Québec Between 1960 et 1980



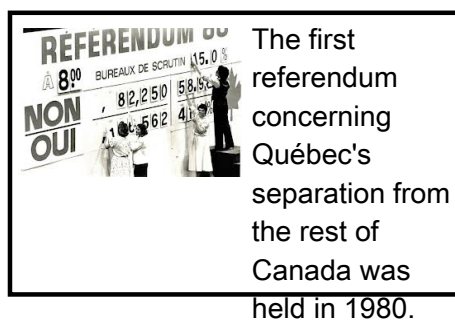
Use the information provided below to draw a timeline displaying some of the key events that took place in the province of Québec between 1960 and 1980.



The Montreal Metro was inaugurated on October 14th, 1966



On June 22, 1960, Jean Lesage's Liberal government won the Quebec general election with 51 of 95 seats and 51 per cent of the popular vote



The first referendum concerning Québec's separation from the rest of Canada was held in 1980.

A young Robert Bourassa became Premier of Québec in 1970



1973 marks the beginning of another financial crisis caused by a steep increase in oil prices.



The nationalization of electricity was accomplished by the Liberal Party in 1963.

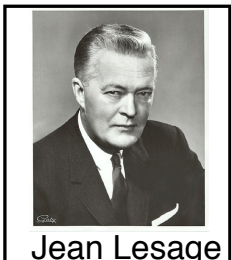
René Lévesque

- ★ Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms



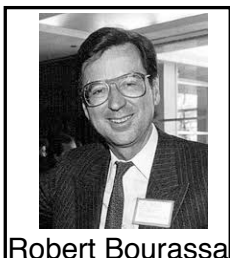
Pierre Elliott

- ★ The creation of many state-owned corporations



Robert Bourassa

- ★ The nationalization of electricity
